



TITLE: “Locked In On True Worship”

OPENING QUESTION: When you hear the word “worship,” what is the first image or activity that comes to mind?

Worship: Intense passion or esteem for a person, place, or thing.

QUESTION: Can you think of examples in everyday life where people clearly worship something—even if they wouldn’t use that word?

Matthew 6:33– But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

John 4:23– Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

QUESTION: Where is it hardest for you personally to seek God first—work, family, comfort, control, or security?

FOR TRANSFORMATION TO CONTINUE, YOU MUST:

- **Lock In On The Fact That You Are A WORSHIPER.**

QUESTION: Jesus says the Father is seeking true worshipers. Why do you think worship that is only external (actions without heart) falls short in God’s eyes?

Exodus 20:3-5– “You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself idols...You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God.”

- **Worship Is CONTINUOUS & A LIFESTYLE.**
- **You Will Become LIKE What You Worship.**

QUESTION: Worship is continuous, not occasional. What does that look like in real life beyond singing songs?

QUESTION: How can ordinary activities (work, parenting, rest, serving, decision making) become acts of worship?

QUESTION: What habits or rhythms help you stay aware of God throughout your week?

Psalms 115:4, 8– But their idols are silver and gold, made by the hands of men...Those who make them will be like them, and so will all who trust in them.



- **Worship Is About INTIMACY.**
- **Lock In On WHAT HAS HE DONE?**

QUESTION: What has God done in your life that you should never forget? How does remembering God's faithfulness fuel genuine worship rather than forced worship? Why is gratitude such a powerful catalyst for worship?

- **My Only Reasonable Response Is Worship.**

Hebrews 12:28-29— ...since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.

- **In View Of Who God Is And What He Has Done, I Bring An OFFERING & I AM THE OFFERING.**

Romans 12:1— Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship.

QUESTION: How does Romans 12:1 redefine worship from something we do to something we become? What does it practically mean to offer your body, time, and life as a "living sacrifice"? What is one specific area of your life God may be asking you to place on the altar this week?
